We are an equal opportunity Program. We will not discriminate against apprentice applicants or apprentices based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex (including pregnancy and gender identity), sexual orientation, genetic information, or because they are an individual with a disability or a person 40 years or older.

All applicants must:

1. Be 18 years of age or older by time of interview.
2. Furnish a VALID Driver's License.
3. Furnish a copy of birth certificate. *If your last name is not the same of that which is on your birth certificate, you will have to provide proof of your name change.*
4. Be a high school graduate by June 5th, 2020. Furnish a high school diploma *(If you have misplaced your diploma, we will accept a letter on the school or school board's letterhead stating that you graduated with a standard diploma, your graduation date and signed by a school official.)* AND an official transcript of high school grades. If you have a GED, furnish an official GED certificate AND official GED test scores. *High school students can submit a letter from school on letterhead stating that you are on track to graduate. Please provide graduation date and your official transcripts before application deadline. You will be required to turn in your diploma and completed official transcripts immediately following graduation.*
5. Furnish an official Driver History Record from the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) covering the last seven years.
6. Be physically able to perform all tasks related to the plumbing and pipefitting industry and pass a physical examination by a medical doctor, if accepted into the program.

7. If accepted, submit to a substance abuse test as required by the Committee.
8. If a veteran, please submit a copy of discharge form DD214.
9. Be of good moral character.
10. Satisfy the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees that you have the ability and desire to master the trade.
11. Agree to participate in remedial instruction required by the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees.
12. Abide by the Standards adopted by the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees.

In addition to the above stated minimums, a good background in mathematics, science, drawing, shop or industrial arts is desirable.

Please note that the applications will be for the apprentice school year starting September 2020. No apprentices will be selected or put to work from total number of applicants until all applicants are interviewed by the Trustees.

The apprenticeship program is sponsored jointly by the Contractors Association and Local Union No. 234.

Students attend school 2 nights per week, Monday through Thursday, for 3 hours per night. A staff of 33 instructors, all of whom are licensed journeymen, conduct classes. At this time, we have 226 apprentices who are enrolled in the program.

Local Union No. 234 Apprenticeship Training includes:

- A minimum of 216 hours of class related instruction each year
- Between 1700 – 2000 on-the-job working hours each year
- Pay raises every 6 months
- Health and welfare benefits
- Retirement benefits
- Certification programs
