RIVERSIDE HIGH SCHOOL COMMUNITY


Rich in history, yet ever evolving in response to our stakeholders' needs and concerns, Robert E. Lee High School was dedicated January 1928 and renamed Riverside High School August 2021. Though our name changed, our mission did not. "Through our focus on math, science, humanities, and technology, we prepare students to achieve excellence in pursuit of lifelong learning for employment and independence in a global economy." Riverside is a Title 1 school that is accredited by the Florida Department of Education and Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Our students continue to show gains in graduation and college-readiness rates.

IMPACT OF COVID-19

Riverside High School was impacted by COVID-19, as many schools were, starting Spring 2020. Students experienced school building closure and the shift to live online instruction March-August 2020. In-person instruction is currently back in place at Riverside, but we are prepared to shift to online instruction if needed. Our curriculum was impacted by the shift in instruction formats. We were not able to provide as many Advanced Placement and dual enrollment classes during the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. The State Reading Assessment graduation requirement was waived for the Classes of 2020 and 2021. Students also had limited opportunities to participate in community service projects during the 2019-2020 school year.

RIVERSIDE CURRICULUM FEATURES

Early College Program – Students enrolled in the Early College Program can earn their AA degree while enrolled in high school. These students participate in college-level courses at the high school and at Florida State College at Jacksonville. Science, Engineering, Math (SEAM) Program -Students in this program participate in Honors and Advanced Placement courses in English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Students also participate in Engineering and Information Technology courses lead by content area experts. Dual Enrollment Program - Juniors and Seniors who meet college admissions criteria can earn college credits in courses at the high school through Florida State College at Jacksonville, Edward Waters College, and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.
